



Undaunted: Series Wrap Up

Introduction: Daniel led a remarkable life; remaining faithful to God and living out his faith in the midst of incredible opposition and loss. His life demonstrates that a believer can thrive, even in a place like Babylon, when their first commitment is always to God.

Discussion Questions

1. Undaunted means to not be discouraged or intimidated by difficulty, danger or disappointment. How have difficulty, danger, or disappointment been a factor in your life over the last year?
2. The first 6 chapters of Daniel cover his life from around 15 years old to in his 80's. Do you know anyone who has demonstrated a life of faithfulness over that kind of age range? How have they influenced or inspired you?
3. **Read Daniel 7:9-12** Daniel has this vision and in it there is a succession of beasts, that we are told are kingdoms, and the last one is mouthy and defiant even as this scene of God taking his throne occurs. What is important to understand about this scene?
4. **Read Daniel 10:12-13 & Ephesians 6:12** The Daniel passage can be difficult to understand, but how is it similar to this passage in Ephesians? Who is our enemy? What is the danger in making unbelievers the enemy? What part does prayer play in spiritual warfare?
5. **Read Daniel 7:13-14** Jesus claims for himself the title that Daniel introduced here. Why do you think he does that? When it says "his kingdom will never be destroyed," what is it talking about? Is there comfort or stress in this passage for you?
6. As you think about the ground we've covered in the Book of Daniel, is there any takeaway for you that would help you live your faith "undaunted?" What does it look like for you?
