

## **Uncomfortable wk2: Uncomfortable Mission**

**Introduction**: Followers of Jesus don't have the option of rejecting Jesus' mission, but many of us don't understand discipleship or have been discipled. Discipleship may sometimes be uncomfortable, but it's never optional. What if we became sold out to the mission of becoming and making more disciples?

## **Discussion Questions**

- 1. The term "mission statement" has been really popular in recent years. Do you think mission statements are important for people or organizations? Are they helpful for churches or do we already have one?
- 2. **Read Luke 6:40** What would it look like to be "fully trained?" What kind of training did you receive after you decided to follow Jesus if any?
- 3. **Read Matthew 28:16-20** Why do you think Matthew shares that some of the them doubted? Why does Jesus begin with a reference to his authority?
- 4. There are 2 kinds of "going." One involves strategically going to another culture to share Jesus. The other involves sharing Jesus wherever you happen to go. Both are necessary. Which one do you think the church prioritizes? If going is seen as the "to mission field," how does that affect how you think most Christians view evangelism or discipleship?
- 5. **Read 2 Timothy 2:2** Paul shares a disciple and leadership reproduction strategy here. Does every Christian share in this responsibility or is this just a leadership thing?
- 6. In the sermon, it was shared that discipleship takes time, relationship, and intentionality. Why are those things important? What other things need to be emphasized for us to make more disciples? How do you see your role in the discipleship cycle?
