

Nagging Questions wk3: Why didn't God answer my prayer?

Introduction: Prayer is powerful, but if we are honest, it can also be confusing. We sometimes see what we believe to be an obvious answer to prayer and rejoice; then we pray just as fervently, and the prayer goes seemingly unanswered. Why does God sometimes not answer our prayers?

Discussion Questions

- 1. Do you remember a time where God answered your prayer? How did it feel? Have you had the opposite experience as well? Did you struggle with that?
- 2. Read **John 14:13-14** Some people see this statement of Jesus as a "blank check." What part of the passage does that ignore? What is Jesus offering?
- 3. Read Luke 18:1 Why does God want us to pray and not give up when He can answer the first time?
- 4. Read **Mark 11:25 and 1 Peter 3:7** How can our relationships with others affect the effectiveness of our prayers?
- 5. Read **2 Corinthians 12:9** One of the options when we pray is that God says no, because he has another plan-that's what Paul hears here. How do you or can you respond when God has a plan different from your prayers?
- 6. What role does faith have in God answering prayer? How can our response to that question be a little dangerous?
- 7. It was said that prayer is not a button to be pushed but a relationship to be pursued. How is prayer a relationship?
