

## The End wk11: Clothed in Christ

**Introduction**: As we approach the "7 bowls of wrath," we find what has been a distraction in the interlude that sometimes causes us to miss something Jesus says at the same time. We need to keep our clothes with us. What does that mean?

## **Discussion Questions**

- 1. In the 11<sup>th</sup> and final video, Shane talks about Heaven. He talked about the healing of 3 relationships, what are they? When you think about heaven, and what happens on earth-what do you usually think about? Anything that he said about heaven that surprised you or you wonder more about?
- 2. Read **Revelation 15:1-4** Before the bowls are poured out, we see a group in heaven singing a song, he says it's the song of Moses and of the Lamb. Why the nod to Moses? Why does the group affirm the judgments before they are poured out?
- 3. Read **Revelation 16:12-16** When you have heard the term "Armageddon" what usually comes to mind? Why has there been so much focus on this one term? Does it surprise you to know it's not an actual place or that the battle never takes place in Revelation?
- 4. What is the instruction from Jesus in this same interlude? What do clothes have to do with it? If Jesus says he comes like a thief what does he mean? Why do we get so caught up in trying to figure out when he will return?
- 5. Read **Romans 13:14 & Galatians 3:27** How do you put on Christ? In this sense, how do you keep your "clothes with you?"
- 6. If the seals said that "your future is secure;" and the trumpets said "be a faithful witness." What is the message of the bowls? If we are to put on Christ, how is that known/shown to others?
