

The End wk13: Wedding Supper of the Lamb

Introduction: John's vision shifts from the defeat of Babylon to the announcement of the wedding banquet of the Lamb. As evil receives it's just punishment, those who have aligned with the lamb prepare to receive Him.

Discussion Questions

- 1. Have you ever been invited to something, like a fancy dinner, where you felt like you didn't belong? How does the invitation itself demonstrate that you do belong?
- 2. Read **Revelation 1:4-5,17-18** Why does John establish the resurrection of Jesus from the beginning of Revelation? How is the resurrection central to the story he shares?
- 3. Read **Revelation 19:5-9** When you hear the references to the church, yourself included, as the bride of Christ; what does that mean? How does that language help and where does it trip people up?
- 4. What is the fine white linen mentioned in the previous passage? What does it represent? Why does what you do as a result of your faith matter?
- 5. Read **Revelation 22:12-14,17,20-21** When you read that Jesus is coming soon, what does that mean? How has the time between the crucifixion and his return been difficult to understand?
- 6. In what way are the resurrection of Jesus and the presence of the Holy Spirit deposits on the promise that Jesus will return again? How should that have encouraged the early church and how does it affect us now?
