

## The End wk15: Don't Miss This!

**Introduction**: The best stories have the best endings. Revelation is not simply a story, but it reveals the whole of human history and the culmination of God's story with us. Make sure that you don't miss the best part because you are caught up in the minor details!

## **Discussion Questions**

- 1. Do you ever like to know how a story ends before you read it or watch the movie? If you had to sum up the end of the story of human history as John reveals it, what kind of story would you say it is?
- 2. Read **Revelation 21:1-5** How many good things can you see that John reveals here? Name all you can see.
- 3. Read **Revelation 22:3** How is this verse demonstrated in the previous passage (Rev 21)?
- 4. Read **Revelation 21:3 & 21:22** One of the earlier promises of Jesus in Revelation to those who would overcome was that they would be a pillar in his temple (Rev 3:12). In heaven, there isn't a temple-is that a contradiction or what else might we learn from that?
- 5. Read **Revelation 21:8 & 21:27** Twice John tells us that not everyone will experience this heaven. What are the requirements? How does that match the calls to repentance throughout the book?
- 6. In the sermon, Jeremy shared a story from a pastor with the central line being "the man on the center cross said I could come." Where does our confidence in getting to experience heaven? What are you called to do in the meantime?
